125	Wednesday, July 1, 2009	Last day for notice of election to be filed with Registrar of Voters office. Includes offices to be filled, length of the term and who will pay for the statement of qualifications. Notice of boundaries and procedures to resolve a tie vote are also required by this date. (EC 10509,10522,15651)
123	Friday, July 3, 2009	Deadline for County Superintendent of Schools to deliver to the Registrar of Voters the Specifications of the Election Order specifying the date and purpose of election. (EdC 5322)
113 88	Monday, July 13, 2009 Friday, August 7, 2009	Declaration of Candidacy and Nomination Papers for <b>ALL</b> local offices. (EC 10220, 10407, 10510, 10603, 13107, 13307)
88	Friday, August 7, 2009	Last day for local entity to request consolidation. Resolution must not contain more than 75-word ballot question. If BOND measure, last day to file Tax Rate Statement. (EC 1405, 9401, 10002, 10403, 12001; EdC 5322)
88	Friday, August 7, 2009	Nomination period closes. (EC 8350, 8403, 8405, 8550, 8105, 8106, 8028, 8040, 10220, 10407, 10510, 10603, 13107, 13307; GC 85601c)
88 78	Friday, August 7, 2009 Monday, August 17, 2009	10-calendar day examination period begins at 5:00 p.m. for documents filed as of the 88th day prior to the election. Between these dates, any registered voter of the election jurisdiction, or the elections official, may seek a writ of mandate or injunction requiring any or all of the the materials to be amended or deleted. The request shall be filed no later than the end of the 10-calendar-day public examination period. Includes resolutions, ordinances, tax rate statements, declarations, and candidate statements. 85	Monday, August 10, 2009	Last day for a Candidate whose filing period ended on the 88th day to withdraw statement. (EC 13307a1, 3)
87 83	Saturday, August 8, 2009 Wednesday, August 12, 2009	Nomination Period Extension for any office when eligible incumbent does not file, or fails to qualify. (EC 8022b, 8204)
83 73	Wednesday, August 8, 2009 Saturday, August 22, 2009	10-calendar day review period - begins at 5:00 p.m. for documents files as of 83rd day. Any registered voter of the election jurisdiction, or the elections official, may seek a writ of mandate or an injunction to require any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted. The writ of mandate or injunction request shall be filed by 08/22/09. (EC 9190, 9295, 9380, 9509)
82	Thursday, August 13, 2009	Random alphabet drawing by County Clerk's office at 11:00 a.m. to draw random alphabet. Candidates or any local measures. (EC 13111i, 13112b, 13116)
81	Friday, August 14, 2009	Primary arguments for or against local ballot measures due (300 words). (EC 9162-63, 9282-83, 9286, 9315-16, 9501-02)
81 71	Friday, August 14, 2009 Monday, August 24, 2009	10-calendar day review period - begins at 5:00 p.m. for primary arguments in favor of or against local ballot measures. Any registered voter of the election jurisdiction, or the elections official, may seek a writ of mandate or an injunction to require any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted. The writ of mandate or injunction request shall be filed by 08/24/09. (EC 9190, 9295, 9380, 9509)

Between these dates, any registered voter of the election jurisdiction, or the elections official, may seek writ of mandate or an injunction requiring any or all of the materials to be amended or deleted. The writ or injunction request shall be filed by 09/03/09. (EC 9190, 9295, 9380, 9509)
60	Friday, September 4, 2009	Overseas Voters will be mailed Vote by Mail Ballot. (EC 3304, 3306)
57 14	Monday, September 7, 2009 Tuesday, October 20, 2009	Statements of write-in Candidacy and Nomination Papers for <b>ALL</b> write-in candidates. (EC 8601, 8604)
40	Thursday, September 24, 2009	First Pre-Election Committee/Candidate Expenditures Statement deadline. Covering the period of 07/01/09 to 09/19/09 (i.e.FPPC Form 460)
40 21	Thursday, September 24, 2009 Tuesday, October 13, 2009	Local Sample Pamphlet mailing. (EC 13300-13304)
29 0	Monday, October 5, 2009 Tuesday, November 3, 2009	Vote by Mail Ballots are available. (EC 3001, 3003)
29 10	Monday, October 5, 2009 Saturday, October 24, 2009	All Vote by Mail Ballot Precincts - Mail ballots to mail ballot precinct voters between these dates. (EC 3005, 4101)
15	Monday, October 19, 2009	Last day to register to vote or submit notice of address change. Forms may be postmarked, but must be received by Election Day. Includes Federal and Military/Overseas voters. (EC 300, 2102, 2107, 2119, 3300, 3302)
14 7	Tuesday, October 20, 2009 Tuesday, October 27, 2009	New citizens may vote in County Election Office. Must provide proof of citizenship and declare residency in California. (EC 331, 3400, 3500-3501, 3503)
12	Thursday, October 22, 2009	Second Pre-Election Committee/Candidate Expenditures Statement deadline. Covering the period of 04/19/09 to 05/16/09 (i.e.FPPC Form 460)
	After Thursday, May 21, 2009	Late Contributions and Independent Expenditures of \$1,000 or more. Covering the period of 09/20/09 to 10/17/09 (i.e.FPPC Form 497)
7	Tuesday, October 27, 2009	Last day to request a Vote by Mail ballot through the mail. (EC 3001)
6 0	Wednesday, October 28, 2009 Tuesday, November 3, 2009	Late applications for Vote by Mail ballots. Voter must return ballot in person or through representative. (EC 3021)
0	Tuesday, November 3, 2009	Vote by Mail Voters - last day to appear before election official, to receive and vote ballot.
0	Tuesday, November 3, 2009	<b>ELECTION DAY!</b> Vote by Mail ballots must be returned to the county elections official or county polling location no later than 8:00 p.m. in order to be counted - includes faxed ballots by special military/overseas voters. (EC 1000, 3017, 3020, 14212, 14311)
