

COVID-19 DAILY STATUS REPORT

CURRENT STATUS:

- As of 3:30 p.m. Friday, January 22, 2021, there are 25,048 confirmed cases (+260 from Thursday) of COVID-19 (novel coronavirus) in Merced County. Approximately 3,542 of those cases are active, and 324 have died.
- Current Risk Tier: Purple (Widespread). Many non-essential indoor business operations are closed.
 - Tiers are determined by the California Department of Public Health based on test positivity and adjusted case rate. Counties can move into more or less restrictive tiers based on these factors. Weekly tiers are updated on Tuesdays. More information: www.covid19.ca.gov/safer-economy/

- Based on information provided by individuals who test positive, Public Health staff will
 continue to assess risks of exposure and contact any affected individuals.
- Due to privacy laws, the Public Health Department cannot release identifying information related to positive cases.

- In an effort to slow the spread of COVID-19 by preventing large group gatherings, the
 County's regional parks (Lake Yosemite, Hagaman Park and Henderson Park) will be closed
 on Saturdays and Sundays until further notice. The parks will remain open on weekdays, but
 physical distancing must be adhered to and large group gatherings will continue to be
 prohibited.
- The Merced County Office of Emergency Services and Merced County Department of Public Health proclaimed a local and public health emergency March 13 in order to help address the outbreak. The Board of Supervisors ratified those actions during a March 16 special meeting.
- The Merced County Public Health Department Operations Center was activated Jan. 27, 2020 (362 days) in order to prepare for COVID-19 in and around our community. The Merced County Emergency Operations Center and Human Services Agency Department Operations Center are also currently active.

COVID-19 Vaccination Distribution: Phases 1

As of January 13, 2021

The supply of COVID-19 vaccine is limited, which means that the vaccine will be offered to different groups of people in different phases, starting with our healthcare workers. As more vaccines become available, it will be offered to everyone. Below is a list of groups that will be offered the vaccine in phases, according to their risk of exposure.

Green circle indicates that the group has been offered the vaccine.

- Yellow circle indicates that the group is waiting to be offered the vaccine.
- Red circle indicates that the vaccine is not yet available at this time.

Phase 1A

Tier1:

- Acute care, psychiatric and correctional facility hospitals
- Skilled nursing facilities, assisted living facilities, and similar settings for older or medically vulnerable individuals
- Residents in long-term care settings
- Paramedics, EMTs and others roviding emergency m
- Dialysis centers

Tier 2:

- Intermediate care facilities for persons who need noncontinuous nursing supervision and supportive care
- Home health care and in-home supportive services
- Public Health field staff
- Primary care clinics, including federally qualified health centers, rural health centers, correctional facility clinics, and urgent care clinics
- Community health workers, including promotoras

Tier 3:

- Specialty clinics (i.e. optometry, cardiology. neurology, outpatient, surgery, physical therapy, etc.)
- Laboratory workers
- Dental and other oral health
- Pharmacy staff not working in settings at higher tiers
- Veterinarians

- Within the public health system, every person who has met CDC criteria for severe disease within Merced County has been tested.
- Public Health is actively identifying other methods to enhance testing capability for providers throughout the community and increase testing county-wide. We will continue to be notified should positive tests come through either system (public health or commercial).

COVID-19 SYMPTOMS AND PRECAUTIONS:

- Coronavirus symptoms include: mild to severe respiratory illness, fever, cough, difficulty breathing, chills, repeated shaking with chills, muscle pain, headache, sore throat, and loss of taste or smell. If symptoms develop, individuals should stay at home to limit exposure to others.
- Anyone who has had contact with a person with possible COVID-19 infection and has the above symptoms should call his/her local health department/health care provider immediately.
- Do not go to your provider's office without calling ahead. Do not call 911 for suspected COVID-19 unless you are having a medical emergency.
- During the flu season, there are steps you can take to protect your health and the health of those around you:
 - Wash your hands regularly with soap and water for 20 seconds.
 - o Avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth with unwashed hands.
 - Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
 - Stay away from work, school or other people if you become sick with respiratory symptoms such as fever and cough.
 - o Cover sneezes or coughs with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
 - Wear a face covering when in public.
