MERCED COUNTY HOSTING SECOND DOSE VACCINE CLINICS BEGINNING THIS WEEK

MERCED COUNTY, CA—Following several successful vaccination clinics last month, the Merced County Department of Public Health is hosting second dose clinics this week to fully vaccinate those who already received their first dose.

Individuals who received their first vaccine through a Merced County clinic at the fairgrounds can expect to be contacted by a company called HR Support to schedule their second dose. Those who receive their first dose through a clinic at Merced College will be immediately scheduled for their second-dose appointment onsite.

The Merced County vaccination schedule is included below. Dates for second doses are approximate and only available by appointment—HR Support will confirm specific times and locations upon contact.
