The course will review the department's use of force policy, ground fighting positions, full mount, side mount, and back mount escapes, guard escapes, bear hug escapes, choke escapes; gun/weapon retention, searching, handcuffing, and personal body weapons. As part of the learning process, the students will be exposed to a high-stress scenario, performance drills, and performance tests.
