

Crisis Stabilization Unit

An Outpatient Program that delivers immediate face-to-face services lasting less than 24 hours. Services are provided at the Marie Green building on a 24-hour basis.

Inpatient Services

Services are available at the Marie Green Psychiatric Center to provide treatment for individuals who need brief hospitalization as a result of a crisis or emergency.

Confidentiality

Behavioral Health staff, contracted agencies, and providers follow legal procedures to honor confidentiality.

Welcome

A variety of behavioral health services and programs are available to behavioral health consumers in Merced County. Behavioral Health and Recovery Services (BHRS) are provided to children, youth, adults, and their families. Inpatient and Outpatient sites have staff who speak Spanish and Southeast Asian Languages along with access to AT&T Language Line for additional translation needs at no cost to consumers. Behavioral Health services are available 24 hours a day and can be accessed by appoint, telehealth, walk-in, or after hours by telephone.

Screening and Referral

Services may be accessed by telephoning the Mental Health Plan (MHP) staff. Callers will speak to licensed mental health worker who will provide referral to programs and/or services most suited to their behavioral health needs.

Merced Children's System of Care

WeCan: A strength-based family-friendly program offering intensive home-based services for families involved in Merced County.

Recovery Assistance for Teens (R.A.F.T.): For children 12 to 17 years old. Provides services for a substance-free and sober life-style for children and families.

Early Periodic Screening, Diagnosis, and Treatment (EPSDT): Medi-Cal services that correct or improve behavioral health problems for children and young people under the age of 21.

Supportive On-Going Services (SOS): A round table of family service agencies coming together to coordinate and problem solve.

Judicial Treatment Services (JTS): Provides Substance Use Treatment in the community.

Therapeutic Behavior Services (TBS): Short-term intensive services designed to stop extreme behaviors that are jeopardizing a child's living situation.

Individual, Family & Group Therapy: Therapy to assist families challenged by circumstances and emotional/behavioral problems.

Doing Whatever It Takes at Home (DoWith): A strength-based family-friendly program offering intensive home-based services for families involved with Child Welfare or Probation.

The C.U.B.E.: Provides drop-in services for youth 16-25 years of age.

Merced Adult Services

Assessments: An assessment is a thorough examination of the current state of an individual's mental, emotional, and behavioral concerns along with history and cultural issues. An assessment determines what services are needed.

Individual, Family, & Group Therapy: Therapy to meet behavioral health needs.

Treatment Planning: Individualized treatment planning.

CalWORKs: Provides Behavioral Health services to assist consumers in successfully returning to the workforce.

Substance Use Disorder: Provides counseling for consumers with Substance Use Disorder issues.

Adult Wellness Centers: Provides drop-in services for adults 18 years of age or older.

Public Conservator/Public Guardian: Provides conservatorship investigation for Merced County. Lanterman–Petris–Short (LPS) Conservatorships are for those who are gravely disabled as a result of a severe mental illness, while Probate Conservatorships are for those who are substantially unable to provide for their own basic needs (primarily adults who cannot care for themselves or manage their own finances).

Public Administrator: Handles the disposition of deceased's estates and administration of estates of persons who die without a will or without an appropriate person willing or able to act as an administrator for the estate.

Representative Payee Program: Manages Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits for those who are unable to manage their own benefits, by paying monthly bills and by ensuring weekly personal needs checks are issued to beneficiaries.
