Penal Code Section 835a(b) states: "Any peace officer who has reasonable cause to believe that the person to be arrested has committed a public offense may use objectively reasonable force to effect an arrest, to prevent escape or to overcome resistance."</p> <p>Discuss and Review Graham vs. Connor</p> <p>Objectively reasonable force may be used:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In self-defense • In defense of others • To effect an arrest • To prevent escape • To overcome resistance • In civil unrest situations <p>Any officer who uses a force option against a suspect beyond objectively reasonable force (Graham v. reasonable level of force to engage the presented threat, if any. Instructor will be observing the officer's reaction to the situation and will look at the use of verbal commands, possible use of less lethal force options, possible use of lethal force, movement, and radio communication.

- After the scenario is completed, Officers will provide a verbal account of what happened, and the decisions they made in engaging the subject. The instructors will review the scenario with the Officers by asking questions in regards to what transpired, their reactions, what else could have been done or done differently.
