- Use the appropriate and reasonable level of force to engage the presented threat, if any. Instructor will be observing the officer's reaction to the situation and will look at the use of verbal commands, possible use of less lethal force options, possible use of lethal force, movement, and radio communication.

- After the scenario is completed, Officers will provide a verbal account of what happened, and the decisions they made in engaging the subject. The instructors will review the scenario with the Officers by asking questions in regards to what transpired, their reactions, what else could have been done or done differently.
